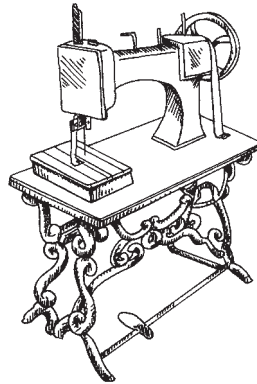


An Introduction to Our Quilting Services

Quilting Services

Quilt Basting 1¢ / square inch
For the hand quilter or home quilter, basting is done in long even rows spaced about 4 inches apart across the entire quilt. Stitches are very long and tension is loose for easy removal.

Level 1 Custom Quilting 2¢ / square inch
Large all over patterns greater than 1 inch in pattern design. Large scale, edge-to-edge pantographs, freehand medium to large meandering and medium to large loops, hearts, stars, leaves, etc.

Level 2 Custom Quilting 3¢ / square inch
Small to medium-size all-over patterns plus one border design with a freehand motif such as vines and leaves. Small to medium-size loops, stars, hearts, leaves, echo designs are also included.

Level 3 Custom Quilting 4¢ / square inch
Small to medium-size designs with many stops and starts. Includes more complicated individual block designs, individual motifs, stitch-in-the-ditch, free-form feathers, pattern outline and small stippling and crosshatching.

- We offer a lovely selection of both solid and variegated 100% cotton thread colors and include up to three solid colors standard with your order. There is an additional charge of \$5.00 for variegated thread.
- Batting must be purchased from Pacific Fabrics & Crafts. Choices include 100% Cotton or a Cotton/Polyester blend.

Binding & Finishing

Binding #1—Prep & Machine Attach to Quilt
15¢ / linear inch with the grain; 20¢ / linear inch on the bias
This service includes cutting your binding fabric, seaming it as necessary, pressing and attaching the binding with a sewing machine so that you can hand stitch it to the back at home.

Binding #2—Prep, Machine Attach to Quilt & Machine Finish
25¢ / linear inch with the grain; 30¢ / linear inch on the bias
This service includes the Binding #1 preparation plus machine top-stitching the binding with corners folded for a mitered look. You will arrive home with a finished quilt!

How do I calculate the size of my quilt in square inches?

To determine the number of square inches, simply multiply the length times the width (in inches). Example: 81" wide x 96" long = 7776 square inches.

How do I calculate how many inches of binding?

Add together both lengths plus both widths of your quilt. Example: 81" wide x 96" long quilt would be $81+81+96+96=354$ inches of binding. *Please note: this formula is to help you figure out the cost of the binding service, not the amount of binding fabric you'll need.*

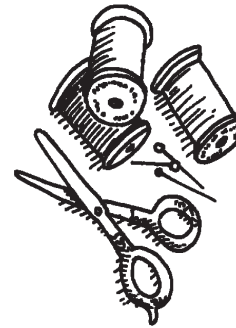
Is there a general guideline?

In general, you will need approximately 1/4 yard (crib/lap) to 1/2 yard (king) of fabric to make straight binding. You'll need from 1/2 yard to 1 yard for bias binding.

How should I prepare my quilt?

Please read and follow the Quilt Preparation information at the right. Improper preparation of your quilt may result in additional charges. If you have any questions, please ask - we'd be glad to help!

Please Read the Following Before Preparing Your Quilt

Additional charges may be added if extra preparation is needed at the time of quilting.

- Be sure your quilt top is clean and free of pet hair and loose threads to prevent damage to our machine or show through on your finished quilt.
- Be sure all seams and stitches are secure. Please correct any wavy or ruffled borders as they will not lay flat in the finished quilt.
- Fullness and puckers pieced into the quilt top cannot necessarily be quilted out. We will do our best, but tops with fullness and puckers may still have them after quilting is completed.
- Iron your top with all seams pressed to one side or open, then fold it neatly.
- If backing is seamed, take care to remove the selvage edge and make sure the sides are straight. Best results are obtained if backing is seamed from top to bottom and seams are pressed open.
- Please remove any basting, tacking or pins.
- If you have a pieced border or bias edges on the outside of your quilt, please stay-stitch 1/4" in from the edge of your quilt to provide more stability.
- Please mark the front, top center edge of the quilt top and backing with a pin or tape if necessary.
- Make sure that your backing is 4" larger than the quilt on each side. Example: if quilt top is 60" x 60" your backing should be a minimum of 68" x 68".
- Please do not supply bed sheets for backing. They are not suitable for quilting and can cause skipped stitches.
- Include binding fabric if we are binding the quilt for you.
- If you have specific ideas about how you would like your top quilted, please consider bringing a rough sketch of the quilting design you have in mind.
