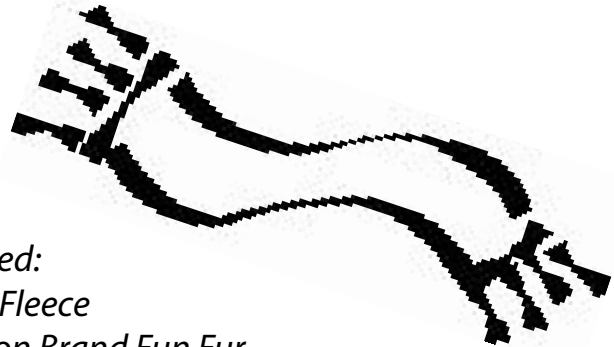


# Yarn-Fringed Fleece scarf



What you'll need:

9" x 60" Fleece

25 yd Lion Brand Fun Fur

Crochet Hook - Size F

*Note: The selvage edge of the fleece is usually nice enough to leave on.*

*Prepare your fleece by squaring up if necessary.*

*Using very sharp pointed scissors, cut tiny holes along each short end of the fleece. Holes should be just large enough to allow the crochet hook to pass. Place the holes about 3/4" from the edge and 3/8" apart.*

*Cut the yarn into 36" lengths. Fold each length in half, then in half again. Pass the crochet hook through the loop created by the last fold in the yarn, then through one hole in the fleece. Catch all yarns with the hook and pull through the loop to knot. Tighten to secure.*

*Repeat until all of the holes have been fringed.*

*Now try it again and use one of these ideas . . . . .*

## Scarf Hints:

- *For an ultra luxurious fringe, use the entire 50 yd skein of Lion Brand Fun Fur and double the fringe.*
- *Try a different yarn. Choose yarns that are bumpy, fluffy or have other textural features.*
- *Try a different fabric. Minkie makes a fabulous scarf! Try velvet or velveteen, too.*
- *Make a narrow scarf and fringe the long edges, too.*
- *When using a print fleece, choose two yarns that coordinate with the print colors. Use together or alternate along edge.*



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
